Eastern Redbud

- *Cercis Canadensis*
- This native small tree branches and parts of their trunk are covered with tiny pinkish-purple flowers. After the flowers, the tree fills its branches with heart shaped leaves.
- They can be found along the wood line at Grey Towers as well as ornamental features in the Visitor Parking lot, which its entire planting is northeastern native trees and shrubs.



'Apricot Impression' Garden Tulip

- *Tulipa Gensneriana 'Apricot Impression'*
- Found in the Long Garden, a garden room created by Cornelia Pinchot in 1924/25, which underwent a historic restoration in 2017, features many herbaceous perennials throughout the season, but the display starts with these orange tulips.
- Cornelia was fond of primary colors in her garden rooms and this salmon color was one of her favorites.



PJM Rhododendron

- *Rhododendron x 'PJM'*
- This small rhododendron is known for its hardiness, reliability, and ornamental value, making it a popular choice for home gardeners
- This flowering shrub can be found at the top of the bluestone stairs leading to the upper lot.
- Planted by the Forest Service as a portal entry when the upper lot was constructed, which was the original visitor lot.
